MONEY REQUEST FOR CONSTITUTION OF AN IMPARTIAL INQUIRY
COMMITTEE.

Respected Sir,

With due respect & honor stated that I served as Chief Executive Officer with effect from 03.8.2022 to 7.3.2023. According to rules of business of District Health Authority the CEO is Principal Accounting Officer and Chairman District Accounts Committee. On 7th & 8th December 2022 meeting held of District Accounts Committee held to discuss the Audit observations for financial year 2021-22 (July 2021 to June 2022. During discussion it was brought into my notice by the Audit Team there are huge embezzlement in financial transactions about amounting to Rs.170(M) pertaining to DHO(MS)(Dr. Hooria Mohsin) related to LP Medicines and General store items and also violations of PPRA Rules which needed a high-level inquiry (PDP-04,PDP-05,PDP-07,PDP-08,PDP-14,PDP-86,PDP-87,PDP-92,PDP-93,PDP-94,PDP-101). I endorsed the recommendations of Audit Party and recommended inquiry, (Annexure A) before this being the principal accounting officer it was my duty to check financial matters of my sub-ordinate offices, after the audit was done for the year 2021-22 and report was submitted by the authorities on 28/9/22. I observed that serious irregularities have been pointed out by audit authorities in record of DHO (MS) so, I requested the competent authority on 23/11/22 (Annexure B) to constitute an inquiry committee on recommendations of the undersigned and DAC, the Primary & Secondary HealthCare Department has directed to the Director Health Services for probing highlighted discrepancies in purchase of District Health officer (Medical Services) Rawalpindi for the year 2021-22 vide letter No. SO (HP)4-1/2022 dated 26th December 2022. (Annexure C) Three member constituted committee by DHS (1. DHS Rawalpindi, MS Wah General Hospital Wah Cant (& Financial Manager O/O DGHS Punjab) inquired the matter and submitted report to Primary & Secondary Health Care Department in which horrible realities comes affront. (Annexure D) The embezzlement of DHO (MS) was more than the Audit party pointed out surprisingly without doing null & avoid or any other observations on report, a new committee constituted by P&SHDC vide letter No.SO (HP) 4-1/2022 dated 14th April 2023 to probe the above embezzlement. (Annexure E) The so constituted committee started inquiry and taken over the related record from DHA Rawalpindi the said committee dissolved due

to unknown reasons and again a new committee constituted with substituted same No. & Date. (Annexure F) The third committee has given task by Department to inquire the matter and submit report within 14 days.

Now it has come to my knowledge that after passing about 06 months the so called 03rd committee furnished report in which Ex-DHO (MS) alleged rheumatics, preposterous allegations of harassment against me which reproduced in inquiry report by committee and on basis of such unethical tactics and usage of women weapon the committee declared that no embezzlement on part of DHO (MS) Rawalpindi. (Annexure G) The committee did not bother to check any record obtained from District Health Authority Rawalpindi nor any statement was recorded.

The inquiry committee also acted a biased roll in whole process which is also questionable & malafied on following grounds.

1. The inquiry committee submitting report fails to probe that for what specific time DC can impose health emergency and after the specific time which is the competent authority to extend health emergency.
2. The committee who submitted inquiry report only verified the authencity of letter, but fails to probe that for imposing emergency no reference of the rules/law under which powers were delegated to DC is given in the letter.
3. The committee fails to probe that when purchases were made and when covid emergency was lifted by NDMA.
4. The committee fails to probe whether purchases made are required in covid or otherwise.
5. The committee didn't bother to look into the facts that at health institutions the Frontline workers fighting against covid are the in charges of health institutions, where demand of items purchased are given by them or otherwise.
6. Once the complaint was lodged by EX-CEO (Health) Rawalpindi, the committee members were bound to scrutinised the complete record before reaching any conclusion but they didn't bother to check record nor record was demanded from DHA (Rwp).
7. According to statement of Ex-DHO(MS) the complaint was based on malafide intentions/harassment by the EX-CEO, the committee didn't bother to probe that whether audit authorities and members of the first inquiry committee was also harassing the innocent DHO(MS)
8. The first inquiry committee nominated officer's/official's involved in this irregular purchase, but the third inquiry committee doesn't feel appropriate to take their statements.

9. The inquiry committee didn't bother to probe that vendor supplying items are registered with income tax department or FBR, whether income tax and sales tax are deposited by them.
10. The inquiry committee didn't bother to give opportunity of hearing to officers or officials.
11. The inquiry committee was constituted on 8th May 2023 and was asked to submit report within 14, days but report was submitted after six months without seeking extension from competent authority for extra time to submit report with specific justifications.
12. The committee also didn't bother to scrutinised that why excess budget was placed at her disposal without approval from the competent authority during mid of financial year without justification.
13. The undersigned recorded adverse from 3rd August 2022 to 31st December 2022 remarks in the PER's of Ex-DHO (MS) that "Reported to be corrupt" considering the report of the First inquiry committee but my remarks was expunge by the Secretary Primary & Secondary Health Care Department Punjab vide order Dated 12/5/2023 (Annexure H) in order to favor the Ex-DHO (M.S).
14. It is also pointed out that the Inquiry against this officer was under process w.e.f 8th May 2023, but without waiting the outcome of inquiry proceedings the said officer was promoted vide order Dated 13th November 2023 (Annexure I).


I hereby request to your honour to kindly constitute an inquiry committee to inquire to about, irregularities, malpractices and embezzlement as pointed out by on

Hope your honor will take up this matter as an all culprits and take action against those involved in these irregularities, malpractices and violation of rules.





LOCAL PURCHASE OF MEDICINES FOR THE YEAR, 2021-22 & 2022-23, IN
VIOLATION OF PEPRA, RULES.


Reference to the Directions of Honorable Minister in Chief Executive Officers conference Dated 31/10/22, regarding local purchases of medicines violating PEPRA, rules and excess utilization of specified budget in excess percentage.

It is submitted that the undersigned securitized the relevant record of District Health Officer (MS) in Head No's RV, 9016, 9017, 9018, & 9020, for the year 2022-23, following observations were made.

1. Local purchase of Rs.7.6 (M) of medicines so far in this current financial year has been made.
2. Medicines were purchased on quotations, instead of tender, violating PEPRA rules
3. Medicines were purchase by splitting the total budget instead of observing rules.
4. Indents were managed without proper specifications and without mentioning quantities.
5. Demand of medicines, equipment and General store items were managed through store keeper and same violation of rules were also made in these purchases. No item was purchased in accordance with demands. The medicines and other items were purchased on higher rates from open market bringing a loss to the Government.
7. District Health Officer (MS) according to delegation of financial powers rules 2017, falls in category (2) officer and can make expenditure up to 2(M) at a time but in this case illegal powers were used than the powers delegated by Government.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

1. Action shall be taken against the concerned under prevailing E&D, rules.
2. Excess payment made should be recovered from the Drawing & Disbursing officer
3. A special enquiry/audit shall be conducted w.e.f financial year 2019-20 to October, 2022-23,
4. Action is proposed against store-keeper also.





With reference to notification No. SO(HP)4-4/2022 dated: 26th December, 2022, An inquiry Committee is constituted to probe the matter of the Irregularities and discrepancies in procurement under DHO (Medical Services) Rawalpindi, Cost Centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23. The committee is consisting of following officers:

1. District Government Audit conducted the annual audit of DHA Rawalpindi for the FY 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 and identified the irregular procurements in violation of PPRA Rules through quotations and splitting of invoices.
2. CEO, DHA Rawalpindi further probed the matter of irregular purchases of DHO MS under cost centers RV 9016, 9017, 9018 and 9020 and requested to the Competent Authority vide letter no 2769/MIS dated 23-11-2022 (Annexure-A) for special inquiry/audit for the FY 2019-2020 to October 2022.
3. The Competent Authority directed to Director Health Services, Rawalpindi vide letter no SO(HP)4-4/2022 dated: 26th December, 2022 (Annexure-B) to probe the matter by co-opting relevant expert(s) and submit a comprehensive report along with recommendations.
4. Director Health Services, Rawalpindi constituted above referred committee vide letter no 10-13/DHS dated 04-01-2023 (Annexure-C).

PROCEEDINGS:

The above referred Inquiry committee requested to CEO DHA Rawalpindi to produce all relevant payment records, stock registers along with expenditure statements of the DHO MS cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial years 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

1. The Inquiry committee checked all payment bills of local purchase of medicine, petty purchases of different items, stock registers and related documents in detail.
2. Meanwhile, the committee physically verified the items of printing, stationery and medical equipment procured during FY 2021-22 that were available.
3. The Committee called store keepers of different BHUs, GRDs along with stock registers for the FY 2019 to 2023.
4. The committee verified the items procured by DHO MS and disbursed to BHUs and GRDs of DHA Rawalpindi and stock entry in stock registers of GRDs and BHUs.
5. Committee asked to store keeper for approved distribution plan for disbursement of procured items of store and LP medicine to 100 BHUs and 15 GRD of DHA Rawalpindi.
6. Committee asked for the demands of 100 BHUs and 15 GRDs against the procurement of Rs. 161,839,587/- under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 for LP medicine, medical equipment/devices, printing, stationery and General store items from store keeper of DHO MS.
7. Committee asked for the demands generated by DHO MS to CEO, DHA Rawalpindi for excessive funds issued under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.
8. Committee asked for any tender process files for procurement of Rs. 159,000,000/- under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 respectively.

OBSERVATIONS:

Expenditure Incurred on Procurement by DHO MS, DHA Rawalpindi under cost center RV9016, RV9017, RV9018, RV9020 under different Object heads during FY 2019-2020 to Dec, 2022.

A. Major object head/Cost center/Financial Year wise comparison of Expenditure of Rs. 171,192,667/- made under all cost center under DHO MS during FY 2019-2020, 2020-2021, 2021-2022 and July- Dec, 2022 is attached as (Annexure-D)

B. The inquiry Committee observed that procurement of printing, stationery, general stores, medical equipment, Local purchase of medicine of Rs. 161,859,587 was made by District Health Officer, Medical Services, DHA Rawalpindi without demands from 100 BHUs, 15 GRDs/GHDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs under DHA Rawalpindi during the Financial Year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

C. Procurement of printing, stationery, general stores, medical equipment, Local purchase of medicine of Rs. 161,859,587 was made by District Health Officer, Medical Services, DHA Rawalpindi without Annual Procurement plan in violation of PPRA Rule 8

"A procuring agency shall, within one month from the commencement of a financial year, devise annual planning for all proposed procurements with the object of realistically determining the requirements of the procuring agency, within its available resources, delivery time or completion date and benefits"

D. It was observed that DHO MS, procured items of printing, stationery, general stores, medical equipment, Local purchase of medicine of Rs. 161,859,587 through quotations rather than open competitive process through tendering in violation of PPRA Rules 22 and 23 during the Financial Year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

"Subject to rules 24 to 38, the procuring agencies shall engage in open competitive bidding if the cost of procurement is more than the prescribed financial limit"

E. Procurement of different items of printing, stationery, General stores, medical equipment and Local purchase of medicines during the financial year were split through splitting of invoices in different dates under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 of DHO MS in violation of PPRA Rules.

F. Procurement of Printing, stationery, General Store, medical equipment and Local purchase of medicines of Rs. 161,859,587 was made in non-transparent manner without full filling

codal formalities from preferred vendors during the FY 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

G. It was observed that payment bills of Rs. 8,965,744/- for the FY 2019-2023 were not produced out of Total procurement of Rs. 161,859,587 to the Inquiry committee.

H. Analysis of Procurement of Printing, Stationary, General Store, Furniture, Plant & Machinery and Medical equipment during FY 2019-2020 to Dec 2022 by Major vendor wise shows that M/S BBQ Traders, Seal Enterprises and FNF Enterprises and other vendors are also indulged, part and parcel of this Non transparent, Irregular procurement at exorbitant rate that have caused loss to the Government. Comparison is as follows,

I. During the inquiry the committee observed that DHO MS, DHA Rawalpindi and Ex-Accountants purchased different items of printing, stationery, General stores, Medical equipment at exorbitant rates than the market rates under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 respectively that caused loss to the government of Rs. 50,292,558/- summary of Govt. loss is given below.

J. Local purchase of medicine funds of Rs. 38,969,162 were utilized for procurement of medicine required to Gynae and labour room patients on day to day purchase for 100

BHUs, 15 GRDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs under DHA Rawalpindi during the Financial Year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

K. These LP medicines were procured on quotations through splitting of invoices on Maximum retail price at exorbitant rates rather than central rate tender made for procurement of Bulk medicine by DHA Rawalpindi or from open tender by DHO MS on Comparative rates that have caused loss to the government of Rs. 12,242,190/- under cost centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020 during financial years 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23.

L. Committee observed that Excessive quantities of items were procured without demand from BHUs, GRDs, MCHCs and MMSs and annual procurement plan in order to generate economic opportunity and to purchase maximum items at exorbitant rates in the best interest of Vendors and DDOs/Accountants (Annexure-M)

M. Printing, stationary, General Stores, medical equipment and Local purchase of medicines of Rs. 161,859,587 were disbursed without approved distribution plan in non-transparent manner during the FY 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23, furthermore during the inquiry no approved distribution plan was presented.

N. During the inquiry store keepers of different health facilities informed that no demands were given for disbursed items of Printing, stationary, General Store, medical equipment and Local purchase of medicine, DHO MS, Accountant/storekeepers disbursed procured items according to their procurement and their quantities at store rather than demands of BHUs, GRDs, MCHCs, MMCs.

O. Committee further observed that stock registers of General Store Items and LP medicine of DHO MS contained fictitious stock entries and issuance of stores. Furthermore, bogus issuance of stores was observed and stock entries were neither contained issuance voucher numbers nor stock registers were counter signed by DDO and store in charge.

P. Committee observed that Excessive funds were issued without any demands generated from DHO MS, DHA Rawalpindi under Cost Centers RV9016, RV9017, RV9018 and RV9020

during financial year 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 respectively; furthermore no formal demands for excessive funds were provided.

Q. Committee observed that DHO MS and accountant also claimed amount of Rs. 9,333,080/- during FY 2019 to Dec 2022 irregularly for transportation of goods and medicines. Year wise expenditure is as follows.

Following observations were observed

1. Payment of transportation of goods were claimed without vendor bills on request of health facilities to reimburse the transportation charges.
2. Exorbitant rates for transportation were claimed.
3. In absence of goods, transportation of bills, committee observed that hospital supplies of adjacent BHUs within same union council and nearby union councils were transported through single vehicle, but transportation reimbursement claim of each health Facility were claimed on reimbursement claim requests.

R. In the absence of transportation bills of vendors and evidence of cash disbursement to health facilities in charges shows bogus claims and misappropriation of transportation funds of Rs. 9,333,080/-.

S. Furthermore, it was observed that rates of transportation claimed were charged on exorbitant rates than market that have caused loss to the Government of Rs. 3,733,232/-

T. The comparison of funds issued to 15 GRDs/GHDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs during July 2019 to June 2021 against during July 2021 to Nov 2022, shows almost 4 to 32 times more funds were issued to GRDs, MMCs and MCHCs and consequently expended under cost centers RV9016, RV9018, RV9020 during the period of 18 months July 2021 to Nov 2022

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U. The comparison of funds issued and consequently expenditure made of Rs. 59,267,917/- for 15 GRDs/GHDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs against 100 BHUs of Rs. 23,212,288 under cost centers RV9016, RV9018, RV9020 during the period of 18 months July 2021 to Nov 2022, during July 2021 to Nov 2022, shows that Number of Dispensaries/MMC/MCHC are 3 time less than BHUs However, the funds issued to GRDs are 3 to 5 times more than BHUs during this period.

V. Committee observed that Ex-Chief Executive Officer and Deputy Director Budget & Accounts of DHA Rawalpindi during FY 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 budgeted and released these excessive funds for 15 GRDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs under Cost centers of RV 9016, RV9018 and RV9020 for the FY 2021-22 and 2022-23.

W. Provision of these excessive funds without requisition and requirement also provide bases for irregular, excessive, non-transparent procurement on exorbitant rates that caused misappropriation and loss to government exchequer.

CONCLUSIONS:

- Procurement of printing, stationery, general stores, medical equipment, Local purchase of medicines of Rs. 161,859,587 was made without demands, Annual Procurement plan in violation of PPRA Rule 8, during FY 2019 to Dec 2022
- Procurement was made through splitting of invoices in different dates through quotations rather than open competitive process through tendering in non-transparent manner without full filling codal formalities from preferred vendors in violation of PPRA Rules 22
- Medicines were procured from LP medicine funds on quotations through splitting of invoices on maximum retail price at exorbitant rates rather than central rate contract made for procurement of Bulk medicine by DHA Rawalpindi or from open tender by DHO MS on comparative rates that have caused loss to the government.

iv. DHO MS, DHA Rawalpindi and Ex-Accountants purchased items of Rs. 152,893,843/- and made payments of Transportation of Goods of Rs. 9,333,080/- during FY 2019 to Dec 2022 at exorbitant rates than the market rates that caused loss to the government of Rs. 66,267,980/-

v. Payment bills of Rs. 8,965,744/- for the FY 2019-2023 were not produced out of total procurement of Rs. 171,192,667.

vi. Excessive quantities of items were procured without demand from BHUs, GRDs, MCHCs and MMCs in order to generate economic opportunity at exorbitant rates in the best interest of Vendors and DDOs/Accountants.

vii. Procured items were disbursed without approved distribution plan in non-transparent manner without requisition from BHUs, GRDs, MMCs and MCHCs.

viii. Stock registers of General Store Items and LP medicine of DHO MS contained fictitious stock entries and issuance of stores that without voucher numbers, signatures of Store keepers and counter signatures of DDO/Store in charge.

ix. Payment of transportation of goods of Rs. 9,333,080/- were claimed at exorbitant rates caused loss to govt. of Rs. 3,733,232/- with fictitious billing without vendor bills on request of health facilities reimbursement have caused misappropriation of funds of Rs. 3,833,000.

x. During July 2021 to Nov 2022 almost 4 to 12 times more funds were issued under different Object Heads to GRDs, MMCs and MCHCs as compared to FY i.e 2019-20 and 2020-21.

xi. During the period of 18 months July 2021 to Nov 2022, during July 2021 to Nov 2022, shows that Number of Dispensaries/MMCs/MCHCs are 3 time less than BHUs However, the funds issued to GRDs are 3 to 5 times more than BHUs during this period.

xii. Ex-Chief Executive Officer and Deputy Director Budget & Accounts during FY 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 budgeted and released excessive funds for 15 GRDs, 6 MMCs and 13 MCHCs for the FY 2021-22 and 2022-23 without requisition and requirement that have provided bases for irregular, excessive, non-transparent procurement on exorbitant rates that caused misappropriation and loss to government exchequer.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

On the basis of Conclusions, Committee recommends that:

- a) Recovery to the Loss to the Government Exchequer amounting to Rs. 66,267,980/-, may be ensured from the concerned Officers / Officials of the District Health Authority Rawalpindi, i.e. Dr. Syeda Hooria Mohsin Ex-District Health Officer Medical Services, Mr. Tarlq Mehmood Niazi Assistant (Ex-Accountant), Mr. Muhammad Khalid Assistant (Ex-Accountant), Mr. Raja Ashiq Iqbal JC (Ex-Accountant) and Mr. M. Riaz Ahmed Assistant (Accountant), Mr. Waseem Balg Medical Technician (SK), Mr. Sayyab Disp (SK), Mr. Naeem Akhtar SK and Umer Hayat SK of DHA Rwp on the charges of Inefficiency, Misconduct and Corruption on the following charges
 1. Procurement on exorbitant rate than market rate caused loss to the Government of Rs. 62,534,748/-
 2. Excessive quantities of items were procured without demand from the BHUs, GRDs, MMCs, MCHCs of Rs. 161,859,587/- to generate economic opportunity at exorbitant rates in the best interest of Vendors and DDOs/Accountants.
 3. Procurement of Rs. 161,859,587 in violation of PPRA rules.
 4. Procured items of Rs. 161,859,587 were disbursed without approved distribution plan in non-transparent manner without requisition from BHUs, GRDs, MMCs and MCHCs.

 - c) Ensure comparison of offered rates under open comparative biddings with central rate contracts of DHQs before award of contracts.
 - d) Disbursement of procured hospital supplies should be as per approved disbursement plan based on annual justified demands of health facilities.

Brief Background:

It is stated that a reference received from Chief Executive Officer, District Health Authority, Rawalpindi, regarding procurement of District Health Officer (Medical Services) for FY 2019-20, 2020-21 & 2021-22. In the DAC meeting, three PDPs were referred to Secretary, Primary & Secondary Healthcare Department to fix responsibility and share the finding of Inquiry report with audit within 30 days time. (Annex-A).

In pursuance of above reference, a Probe committee was nominated under the convenorship of Additional Secretary (Reforms & Initiatives), P&SHD, alongwith Director Health Services (HQ), DGHS and Public Health Specialist (M&E), DGHS, as members to examine the case and submit its recommendations within 14 days as per rules and procedures.

Proceeding of Probe Committee:

The Probe committee collected the complete record of audit paras, working papers, audit verification remarks, bills of each audit observations, demand sheet, vouchers, stock entries and distribution plans and recorded written statements.

I. PDP-87 Irregular expenditure due to purchase without observing PPRA - Rs140.296 million

A. Audit Verification remarks in DAC and recommendations in Audit para:

- The Deputy Commissioner letter no of 14.03.2020 regarding declaration of health emergencies implementation time period needs to be clarified. DAC may keep the para pending and probe the matter for not calling tender during FY 2020-21 and 2021-22. Auditor recommends regularization besides fixing responsibility on the concerned officer/official. (Annex-B).

B. Observations of Committee:

- The committee verified the demand, bill voucher and stock entries. It was found that all the procurements were made on quotation basis. DHO (MS) Rawalpindi, procured items like surgical mask, VTM, Hand Sanitizer, Latex Gloves etc. on quotations.

• During verification of record, a notification of Deputy Commissioner, Rawalpindi was shared with probe committee regarding declaration of Health Emergency (Annex-C). Therefore, PPRA rules were relaxed due to emergency hence, surgical mask, VTM, Hand Sanitizer, Latex Gloves etc. were procured on quotation basis. It is observed that major items were purchased during peak time of Covid-19. The case of regularizing expenditure highlighted in the audit para may be forwarded to Finance Department as per recommendations of audit for settlement of audit para.

II. PDP-92 Irregular expenditure on purchase of LP medicines - Rs30.894 million

A. Audit Verification remarks in DAC and recommendations in Audit para:

• The reply of department is not satisfactory and no evidence of non-functional of LP portal shown during verification. Audit recommends regularization of the matter besides fixing of responsibility for non-compliance of rules. (Annex-B).

B. Observations of Committee:

• The committee verified the demands, bills and stock entries. It was found that all the procurements were made by DHO (MS) on quotation basis instead of calling tender for all the 133 Health Facilities.

• During verification of record, a notification of Deputy Commissioner, Rawalpindi was shared with probe committee regarding declaration of Health Emergency (Annex-C). The committee is of the view that PPRA rules were relaxed due to emergency. The case of regularizing expenditure highlighted in the audit para may be forwarded to Finance Department as per recommendations of audit for settlement of audit para.

III. PDP-94 Irregular expenditure due to purchase without observing PPR - Rs21.199 million

A. Audit Verification remarks in DAC and recommendations in Audit para:

• DAC may keep the para pending as no annual planning was done and indent was split up to avoid tender. Audit recommends regularization from Competent Authority. (Annex-B).

B. Observations of Committee:

• The committee verified the demand, bill voucher and stock entries etc. It was found that all the procurements were made on quotation basis due to emergency. DHO (MS&PS)

Y A & J

Rawalpindi, procured items like AMBO Bags Adult, Fetal Doppler, Nebulizer, Patient stool, Family Planning register etc. on quotations for all the 133 health facilities.

- During verification of record, a notification of Deputy Commissioner, Rawalpindi was shared with probe committee regarding declaration of Health Emergency (Annex-C). The committee is of the view that PPRA rules were relaxed due to emergency. The case of regularizing expenditure highlighted in the audit para may be forwarded to Finance Department as per recommendations of audit for settlement of audit para.

Statement of District Health Officer (Medical Services), DHA Rawalpindi:

"During my tenure nearly 04 Chief Executive Officers remained posted and except last complainant CEO, all found my performance up to the mark and they never gave targeted treatment with vicious intent. But the complainant had malicious motives of harassment and started victimizing by different tactics including the instant complaint. He used to force me to sit in his office without any reason. He irrelevantly forced me to escort him in to travel for different meetings. Seeing my cautious response he started victimizing, doing insults and resorting complaints. At last due to his pestering, I left the DHA, Rawalpindi and moved to BBH by getting transfer."

"Furthermore, it is stated that huge demand of nearly 135 Health facilities was covered. Due to time constraints and prevailing emergency situation during the COVID pandemic, the targets were met by purchase of medicine on quotations as per PPRA rules. Moreover, all the process of procurement was signed by the "Purchase committee" and quantity was verified by "Inspection committee". During COVID emergency was declared by Government and PPRA rules were suspended. I have performed my duties with my full capacity and in good faith. There was no embezzlement found by any Audit officer." (Annex-D)

Conclusion:

After perusing of record, examining available evidence/statements, the probe committee unanimously is of the view that:

- The notification of Deputy Commissioner, Rawalpindi duly attested by the then Cap (R) Muhammad Anwar-ul-Haq Azad, DC, Rawalpindi regarding declaring Health Emergency that shows PPRA rules relaxation.
- Moreover, the audit team did not highlight any embezzlement, misappropriation and blockage of funds in the audit para.

Recommendation:

On the basis of above conclusion, it is recommended that:

- Probe report may be shared with DG Audit as per decision of the DAC Minutes of Meeting alongwith reference to Finance Department for regularization of expenditures.
- There is no embezzlement, misappropriation and blockage of funds showing negligence on the part of DHO (MS), Rawalpindi.

(P.S. 20/10/22)

- 1. Local purchase of Rs.7.0 (M) of medicines so far in this current financial year has been made.
- 2. Medicines were purchased on quotations, instead of tender, violating PEPRA rules.
- 3. Medicines were purchase by splitting the total budget instead of observing rules.
- 4. Indents were managed without proper specifications and without mentioning quantities.
- 5. Demand of medicines, equipment and General store items were managed through store keeper and same violation of rules were also made in these purchases. No item was purchased in accordance with demands. the medicines and other items were purchased on higher rates from open market bringing a loss to the Government.
- 6. District Health Officer (MS) according to delegation of financial powers rules 2117 falls in category (2) officer and can make expenditure up to 7(M) at a time but in this case illegal powers were used than the powers delegated by Government.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(P.S. 20/10/22)

- 1. Action shall be taken against the concerned under prevailing I & D, rules.
- 2. Excess payment made should be recovered from the Drawing & Disbursing officer.
- 3. A special enquiry/audit shall be conducted w.e.f financial year 2019-20 to October, 2022-23.
- 4. Action is proposed against store-keeper also.

**WRITTEN STATEMENT IN PROBE FOR LOCAL PURCHASE OF MEDICINES FOR
THE YEAR, 2021-22 & 2022-23 IN VIOLATION OF PPRA, 2014**

Respectfully, it is submitted that I am SWMO currently serving in BBH Rawalpindi and remained posted as District Health Officer (MS), District Health Authority, Rawalpindi w.e.f. 22.10.2019 to 01.12.2022. District Health Authority Rawalpindi consists of 40 - 50 DDOs and all work of the authority is going on in due course and in normal/moderate way of affairs and no drive of special accountability or the day of reckoning is being conducted except my chosen case to realize ulterior motives of the complainant.

During my tenure nearly 04 Chief Executive Officers remained posted and except last complainant CEO; all found my performance up to the mark and they never gave targeted treatment with vicious intent. But the complainant had malicious motives of harassment and started victimizing by different tactics including the instant complaint. He used to force me to sit in his office without any reason. He irrelevantly forced me to escort him in to travel for different meetings. Seeing my cautious response he started victimizing, doing insults and resorting complaints. At last due to his pestering, I left the District Health Authority, Rawalpindi and moved to BBH by getting transfer.

So far as the complaint is concerned the contents of complaint are explicit that this case is person specific, pick and choose and outcome of malicious personal vendetta. It is an attempt to misuse of his official position.

My point wise reply of his complaint is given as under:

- 1) My duty was to provide medicines to health facilities under my control. It is to mention here that PHEMC is not in contract for Rawalpindi district and in face of huge demands nearly 135 health facilities were run in such a manner that no shortage of medicine was ever complained for. The MEA criteria, CEO scorecard, specific standards of essential medicine were met within budgetary provision. Moreover, due to late receipt of DTL reports for bulk medicines the gap was met through local Purchase.
- 2) Due to time constraint and prevailing emergency situation during the COVID Pandemic, the targets were met by purchase of medicine on quotations, the method

As and when needed the quotations were called for required medicines, on receipt of quotations these were scrutinized and thereafter a comparative statement was prepared and signed by "Purchase committee" by declaring lowest bidder as responsive. Then the lowest bidder was given order for supply within stipulated time and other conditions. On receipt of supply another committee named "Inspection Committee" comprising of nominated store officer examined the supply physically for entering into stock register and signed the entries of store received. Then the officials of store department disbursed the medicine as per distribution plan.

3) As emergency was declared during COVID Pandemic by government and the PPRA Rules were suspended (copy enclosed). therefore, terming different expenditure as long period as aggregate and calling it splitting is not a correct objection

4) It is a flimsy objection to entangle in technicality. The head of the office is responsible to provide the items required to meet the knock down criteria and CFO scorecard. Nowhere the DHO (MS) has been prohibited from assessing the need and providing items to health facilities accordingly. During the emergency and available short period, Demands are always too high to meet. It is the officer who viewing the resources determines the size of purchase.

5) The store is an institutionalized department and the store keeper with an automation replete the store before complete depletion of recurring items. With the passage of time store officials have acquired competency to determine average usage of different items. They are well versed with seasonal ups and downs of demands. The rule has not been quoted by the complainant of which violation has been made.

6) The objection of complainant that items were purchased on higher rate, whereas, he has not described the standard for measuring rates. It is common information that no official purchase can be made from open market beyond procedure of PPRA Rules even though some time having knowledge that a specific item is of lower rate in open market.

7) The objection is baseless. Every bill is within financial powers. Aggregation of different bills cannot be taken to adjudge financial powers. As PPRA Rules were suspended during COVID Pandemic, hence to meet the demand and provide uninterrupted supply to all medical facilities we utilized our budget for preventive measures and there is no loss incurred to the Government.

8) All the medicines which were procured during this tenure were utilized within the date of expiry. The whole department was working on war footing basis and I have performed my duties with my full capacity and in good faith. There was no embezzlement found by any Audit officer.



Respectfully, it is submitted that I am SWMO currently serving in BBH Rawalpindi and remained posted as District Health Officer (MS), District Health Authority, Rawalpindi w.e.f. 22-10-2019 to 01-12-2022. District Health Authority Rawalpindi consists of 40 - 50 DPOs and all work of the authority is going on in due course and in normal/moderate way of affairs and no drive of special accountability or the day of reckoning is being conducted except my chosen case to realize ulterior motives of the complainant.

During my tenure nearly 04 Chief Executive Officers remained posted and except last complainant CEO, all found my performance up to the mark and they never gave targeted treatment with vicious intent. But the complainant had malicious motives of harassment and started victimizing by different tactics including the instant complaint. He used to force me to sit in his office without any reason. He irrelevantly forced me to escort him in to travel for different meetings. Seeing my cautious response he started victimizing, doing insults and reporting complaints. At last due to his pestering, I left the District Health Authority, Rawalpindi and moved to BBH by getting transferred.

So far as the complaint is concerned the contents of complaint are explicit that this case is person specific, pick and choose and outcome of malicious personal vendetta. It is an attempt to misuse of his official position.

My point wise reply of his complaint is given as under:

- 1) My duty was to provide medicines to health facilities under my control. It is to mention here that PL+MC is not in contract for Rawalpindi district and in face of huge demands nearly 135 health facilities were run in such a manner that no shortage of medicine was ever complained for. The MEA criteria, CEO scorecard, specific standards of essential medicine were met within budgetary provision. Moreover, due to late receipt of DTI reports for bulk medicines the gap was met through Local Purchase.
- 2) Due to time constraint and prevailing emergency situation during the COVID Pandemic, the targets were met by purchase of medicine on quotations, the method

provided in PPRA Rules. The procedure provided in PPRA Rules was complied strictly. 
I agree with the initiating officer.




